IRON BUTT AWARD 2017



The thirty one (31) participants of the Iron Butt Award 2017 rode their bikes nearly 300'000 km or more than seven times around the world last year. The hardest butt must belong to Julian Paschke from Chapter Germany 2. He rode for 17'900 km

in the saddle in 2017 and made the award for the second time. For this he will become the silver patch. The fourth time has made the award Gery "Dutchy" Jansen from Switzerland 1. He is the first Red Knight who become a patch with a golden star.

The Iron Butt Award was introduced in 2014 by the Red Knights MC European Association. The goal of the award is to motivate all Red Knights to ride their motorcycle more often and visit more chapters. First, the award was for European Red Knights only but since 2017 the award is open for every Red Knight in good standing. The only restriction is that only riders can participate, not their passengers.

Every Red Knight who ride 10'000 km or more in one calendar year and send photos and money to the European association will receive a certificate and a patch. In the first year the patch will be colored bronze, then silver and the third time gold. The following patches show one or more golden stars.

To participate the award is very easy. At the beginning of the year you must take a photo of your odometer. At the end of the year you take a second photo and show that you have a difference of 10'000 km or 6'220 miles on your odometer. If you have more than one bike you do this for every one of your bikes and add up the differences. Then you send this photos with your postal address to the email address of the award manager. Parallel you have to send the money (€ 10.--) to the treasurer of the European Association. Barbacue is held every year in the Fun Park Vrata, and the gathering is completed with a dinner at the PFB Rijeka – station Vežica.






